



ISTH and NNHF initiate collaboration to build capacity for bleeding disorders

We are pleased to announce the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding between the Novo Nordisk Haemophilia Foundation (NNHF) and the International Society on Thrombosis and Haemostasis (ISTH). This agreement establishes a framework for collaboration on the ISTH Regional Training Centre (RTC) programme over a period of three years.

The ISTH RTC programme focuses on building knowledge capacity by offering training opportunities in low- and middle-income countries, with centres currently established in Brazil, India, Pakistan, Malaysia and Thailand. This is achieved through the sharing of best practices, knowledge exchanges and participation in joint projects between emerging and mentoring centres. NNHF will strengthen and expand the impact of the ISTH RTC programme by offering support for equipment in qualifying centres.

"The ISTH is pleased to partner with NNHF to expand the support for the programme's emerging Centres. Through this partnership, the two organisations have agreed to collaborate and provide funding to the RTC programme by expanding the offer to include the availability of NNHF support for laboratory and physiotherapy equipment as part of the general ISTH application process. The NNHF will evaluate approved applications for equipment support and grant funding based on criteria including the advancement of bleeding disorder care and treatment in the country or region. ISTH and NNHF will jointly monitor the project and evaluate outputs.

To date, the programme has benefitted thousands of people with haemostatic and thrombotic disorders. This number will only increase over the next three years thanks to improved diagnosis capacity made possible by funding from the NNHF along with capacity-building efforts by the ISTH, leading to an expanded and strengthened network of centres able to offer improved care of blood disorders.

"We are excited to initiate this collaboration with the ISTH.
